UNIMONT will take part in the conference "Forest Landscape Restoration: a new approach to mitigate soil erosion"

ITALY PAVILLION EXPO MILAN - 24TH OCTOBER, 2015

Soil erosion and forest degradation are interdependent aspects caused by the same problem; the anticipated worsening of environmental stress factors because of global change will aggravate the situation all over the world. Any attempt to mitigate soil erosion must take into account the forest cover of a particular area. Moreover, a high percentage of forests in the world is in a state of considerable degradation and so any action to halt soil erosion must start from forest restoration.

The selection of "functionally adequate" plant species that, in addition to performing their specific function, are also able to mitigate erosion, could be a sustainable strategy for forest restoration.

This approach could also include the adoption of a strategy of "assisted migration" of forests. The practice of "assisted migration" is based on the assumption that evolution cannot keep pace with climate change. Linking the mitigation of soil erosion and forest restoration could be a successful strategy, not only to protect the natural resources of a region but also to contribute to the economic development of the population living in the area. These fundamental principles underlying a modern vision of FLR (Forest Landscape Restoration), fully integrated into a broader concept of green economy, will be discussed during the conference.



The conference, with the participation of Anna Giorgi, center director GeSDiMont (MountainUniversity - UNIMI) will focus on the general concept of soil erosion and will provide examples of sustainable strategies adopted to increase soil protection

through the development of efficient forest cover. Ample space will be devoted to using a theoretical framework to design policy guidelines useful to public and

private entities responsible for the implementation of this new approach to fight soil erosion.

Meeting with the delegation of the Basque Government visiting the Mountain University

EDOLO - 21st October, 2015



The Mountain University welcomed the delegation of the Basque Government* to Edolo on Wednesday, 21st October, 2015. Members of the delegation included experts of the Basque Government department dedicated to the mountains and Dr. Juanan Gutierrez, President of EUROMONTANA, an organization in Brussels representing European mountain areas, of which Gesdimont - UNIMONT is an active member.

The organization of this event stemmed from the desire to strengthen academic and institutional networks in order to promote the socio-economic potential of mountain areas, teaming up in order to focus on common issues and to progress from a concept of "marginality" to that of shared resources, also at an international level.

Unimont presented its current activities, working to create an innovative cultural hub designed to connect universities, institutions and stakeholders as regards important issues for the mountains, promoting interaction through education, dissemination of knowledge, provision of practical information, research and experimentation - the transformation of theory into good practice for communities and local institutions.

In conclusion, space was given to some young entrepreneurs trained at the Mountain University and to some representative and outstanding activities in the mountains of the Vallecamonica. Young entrepreneurs included Valentino Bonomi (owner of the San Faustino farm), Andrea Bezzi (president of the Consortium Silter Vallecamonica and owner of Az. Agr. Bezzi) and Marco Cicci (junior agronomist - technician in the Comunità Montana della Valle Camonica) - who recounted their experiences in mountain areas of the Lombardy Region.

The visit was an opportunity for interaction and discussion, aimed at creating partnerships between the Mountain University, a centre of excellence for training and research, specializing in the study and analysis of the complexity of the mountain territory, and the delegation of a government whose territory is largely mountainous, and is part of the initiatives of networking and internationalization provided for in the framework agreement with the Ministry of Education, University and Research.

Montagna & dintorni is a cultural festival with free events, this year the tenth edition is full of for mountain lovers.

This year the main themes at Montagna & dintorni include sustainability, the valorization of mountain areas, a healthy and traditional diet.



The 2015 edition, organized by the municipality of Vogogna, with UNCEM Piedmont, Parco Val Grande and Comunità Montana valli dell'Ossola, was organized in collaboration with Association ARS.UNI.VCO, Italy Fondazione Montagne Italia and the Mountain University. Vogogna castle hosted educational seminars and conferences on topics related to the mountain in a broad sense: sports, biodiversity, renewable energy, nutrition, history and much more.

Livability in the mountains, interregional conference in Milan EXPO

EXPO - 13th October 2015

The Mountain University took part in the conference "Livability in the mountains: the need for shared action for the protection of common interests." The **Piedmont Region** was the main organizer of the event (in collaboration with the **Conference of Regions** and Autonomous Provinces, **Valle d'Aosta** Regions, **Veneto**, **Friuli Venezia Giulia**, **Lombardy** and the autonomous provinces of **Trento** and **Bolzano**).

The event provided an opportunity to reinforce the "network" of interests and objectives common to all regions in the Alps, centring on the theme of the "livability of mountain areas" with the aim of drawing up a policy approved by all the administrators, as well as to share models, cases and positive regional and international experiences with a focus on education/knowledge, sustainable development and social innovation.

Anna Giorgi, GeSDiMont center director - (MountainUniversity - UNIMI) was present at the meeting where she spoke about UNIMONT. Her speech took place during the second session "Excellent cases, reproducible experiences and models" highlighting the potential of the "highlands" with Unimont's innovative proposal, ranging from direct action to the conservation of mountain areas in a national and international dimension.. The aim is to convert the large network created to date in a CULTURAL HUB for the mountains in a European and International context.

SURVEY AND SET UP OF A MARTELLODROME IN THE BOSCO DELL'IMPERO IN EDOLO

The purpose of the internship is to survey silvicultural and dendrometric parameters necessary to create a martellodrome (or martelloscope) in the "Bosco dell'Impero" wood in Edolo, already the subject of other theses. Work will be developed through the selection and delimitation of the most suitable ground and in a survey of all forest species present through their main dendrometric parameters. Objective of the internship is to make a test field available to degree course students, near to the Edolo campus, where forestry issues can be practised. Requirements include enthusiasm for the subject and a willingness to undertake challenging survey work in the field.

INTERNSHIP OPPORTUNITY

TWENTY YEARS OF CONVERSIONS IN THE TOWN OF BEECH coppice Cusino, Lepontine (CO).

Conversion of tall trees has been ongoing for the last twenty years in aged beech coppices of the municipality of Cusino, Lepontine Alps in the province of Como, when firewood is cut for public use. The aim of the internship, and hence thesis, is a survey of outcomes and conversion methods, an analysis of the results obtained, suggestions for continuing the activity in areas still to be converted and those already subject to conversion. The area is accessible by road (difficult access in winter), located above the village of Cusino. Requirements include skill and enthusiasm for surveys in the field, which will be many and demanding, in a mountain forest environment of great interest.
