THE UNIMONT NETWORK CONTINUES TO EXPAND

Unimont has, for years, been committed to building a network for the mountains to join forces, create opportunities, provide support in complex situations and find solutions to optimize both the management of mountain areas and costs, as well as meeting the requirements of local communities.

The network continues to expand and the Edolo Centre is working to involve other Italian universities: the University of Milan through the Interdepartmental Centre for the Sustainable Management and Protection of Mountain Areas (Ge.S.Di.Mont.) has now signed a new agreement with the [University of Eastern Piedmont](#), in order to cooperate on initiatives regarding mountain issues, hence strengthening their impact and enhancing their effectiveness nationwide.

The prestigious University of Eastern Piedmont joins those of Brescia, Florence, Milan, Padua and Turin, which have been part of the network since 2013.

11th April is the enrolment deadline for the advanced course in "Policies for the development and enhancement of mountain areas, legislation for mountain areas".

The training course aims to provide knowledge and skills related to specific legal regulations and issues, as well as developing methodological aspects, so as to provide the tools for understanding and applying legislation issued by various institutions and organizations (regional, national or international) regarding mountain issues.

It is aimed at all those involved in development intervention and policies for mountain areas and for those who work in contact with public authorities and mountain institutions that, at this time of transition, can benefit from new legislation aimed at "vertical territories".

"NERO SPINOSO" CORN OF VALLECAMONICA

The process to register the "nero spinoso" corn of Vallecamonica in the conservation varieties section of the Italian National Register of Agricultural and Horticultural Species has ended successfully. The application was submitted by the Centre of Applied Studies for the Sustainable Management and Protection of Mountain Areas ([Ge.S.Di.Mont.](#)) in collaboration with the Municipalities of [Piancogno](#) and [Esine](#) in March 2016. In January 2016 the [Ministerial Decree dated 12/14/2015](#) was published in the Official Gazette of the Italian Republic, important

The registration of this ancient variety represents an important attainment safeguarding Italian agro-biodiversity and enriching the agro-food heritage of the Valle Camonica. The "nero spinoso" corn project is part of the work carried out at the Edolo centre to promote mountain agriculture and the specificities of the territory, focusing on unique and high-quality products.

LOCAL CALLS 2016

The Fondazione della Comunità Bergamasca has published its local calls for 2016: an opportunity for non-profit organizations and the area as a whole.

Funding for the 9 calls amounts to 1,600,000 Euros together with 350,000 Euros allocated by the Conference of Mayors, for a total of 1,950,000 Euros.

Funding will be allocated to "standard" calls in social, cultural and artistic sectors, with additional targeted subdivisions, and also allows for calls in partnership with institutions. New this year, the call dedicated to micro-funding, developed following public consultation with stakeholders last December: the intention is to send a positive signal to individual local communities for the realization of small-scale projects in both social and cultural sectors.

FIELD TRIP TO CEVA

Also this year the students of the second and third year of the degree course in Conservation and Sustainable Development of Mountain Areas will travel to Ceva (CN) to the Training Centre – Military Barracks M.O.V.M. Ten. Col. Giuseppe Galliano, of the State Forestry Corps. The students, accompanied by lecturers, will enjoy a week of activities aimed at enriching their knowledge of agriculture and forestry. In particular they will be able to follow theoretical and practical lectures on various issues such as organic farming, biodynamics, hazelnut cultivation, oenology and Safety Controls in the agro-food sector, as well as visiting the University of Gastronomic Sciences in Pollenzo (Bra) and some mountain farms in order to gain a comprehensive overview of local conditions in the primary sector.

ADVANCED COURSE IN ROCK ART

The course in "Recording Art Rock. New methods for the documentation and management of alpine and valley heritage" is organized by UNIMONT in collaboration with the [Valcamonica Centre for Prehistoric Studies](#) in order to train new experts and transform historical and cultural heritage into opportunities for the sustainable development and economic growth of such areas. The course aims to provide participants with a wide view both geographically and chronologically, and to bring together complementary disciplines, so as to provide practical skills to future specialists in rock art.

Lessons will include both theoretical and practical sessions on mapping using GPS and total station as well as the creation and management of databases. There will also be lectures on geoarchaeology and archaeobotany as well as the conservation and restoration of archaeological heritage.

The course offers the possibility of learning and gaining practical experience to European students and graduates, offering lectures and contributions from professors and other experts working in Italy, Spain, Portugal, Scandinavia and England. The course also provides access to the Centre's network of experts at universities and research institutes across Europe .

The course, which is intensive, will take place from 22nd August to 4th September 2016. Enrolment will open in the coming months, but those interested can already send a CV and a motivational letter to corso.edolo@unimi.it.

INTERNSHIP CAPRA BIONDA DELL'ADAMELLO

Students are urgently required for the internship: "Study of Goat breeding – Capra Bionda dell'Adamello". In particular, students will have to monitor the daily intake of lactating goats, and to evaluate specific rations depending on the stage of lactation. They will also follow the phases of milking, monitoring milk production and quality, as well as the milk processing stages for the production of Fatulì cheese. The objective is to study the problems related to the management of a herd of Capra Bionda dell'Adamello goats selected for improvement of the breed in the area of Cevo (BS) assessing managerial, production, dairy and economic aspects.

ZOOTECNICAL AND AGRONOMY INTERNSHIP

The internship: "Environmental, zootechnical and sustainability assessment of Alpine pasture" is available in Alpine pasture in the municipality of Toscolano Maderno (BS).

The objective is to draw up a project of sustainable development in the area taking into account livestock and agronomic (herbaceous and wood production) production potential, and any tourist and economic aspects of future sustainable development.

Students will have to collect data from every possible source (land registry, archives, historical documents ...), carry out surveys on the current situation of pasture and forest areas (use of pastures, types of forests, maintenance, road network ...) and elaborate potential improvement strategies. Each student may work on one or more of the issues to be studied, taking into consideration existing data as well as performing field work.

INTERNSHIP PLANT BIOLOGY

UNIMONT students who have passed the exam in Plant Biology and Plant Ecology can apply for the internship: "Distribution of *Linaria tonzigii* in upper Val Brembana (Monte Cavallo, Orobie Bergamo)".

Linaria tonzigii is a rare and steno-endemic plant of the Bergamo Prealps inserted in the IUCN red list of threatened species and Annex II of the Habitats Directive (92/43/EEC). Currently *Linaria tonzigii* populations are only partially in protected areas; it is therefore necessary to identify examples of this species and activate appropriate conservation procedures.

The work will mainly consist in surveying and mapping *Linaria tonzigii* in an area of the Orobie Bergamo (Monte Cavallo, Valleve, BG) which is not protected in order to have a detailed picture of the presence of this species in the area and to evaluate possible conservation strategies.

Field work will be conducted mainly during summer 2016. The data collected will be analysed using GIS software at the Ge.S.Di.Mont centre in Edolo.

The work is appropriate for undergraduate and master's degree students studying Cultural Heritage and Archaeology Sciences, Environmental Sciences, Earth Sciences, Life Sciences, Agricultural Sciences of all universities. It can also be studied in depth as part of an advanced course.

A presentation of the book and research project: "The Guns of Guspessa. The municipalities of Edolo, Cortenedolo and Mu at the start of the Thirty Years' War" will be held at the Unimont headquarters, on Thursday, 21st April, 2016, at 8.30 p.m..

This new book of the [Servizio Archivistico Comprensoriale di Valle Camonica](#) was published in collaboration with the [municipality of Edolo](#) and thanks to funding from the [Lombardy Region](#) and is a little-known episode in the history of Edolo:

"In November–December 1624, the Republic of Venice sent a battery of cannons to Valtellina to support the French army under the command of the Marquis Coeuvres. The guns were transported from Brescia, where the main arsenal of Western Terra Ferma was situated, across Lake Iseo and Valcamonica. Here, the municipality of Edolo hosted the operation coordinator, Marc'Antonio Canal Provveditore in Valcamonica".

SECOND TECHNICAL TABLE ON SAFFRON

The second technical table concerning the cultivation of saffron (*Crocus sativus*) was held at the Mountain University in Edolo on Friday, 11th March. The event was attended in Edolo or online via a virtual classroom by a number of producers from all over Italy. The technical table was chaired by the Ge.S.Di.Mont. Director (Annamaria Giorgi) and a team of researchers from the Mountain University that deals with issues concerning saffron (Daniela Pentimalli, Sara Panzeri and Luca Giupponi) and qualitative analysis of the spice.

The event was an opportunity to inform producers (experienced and novice) about the many activities that Unimont has carried out and is planning in order to support and improve the cultivation of saffron and also allowed an exchange of information between farmers and researchers, providing useful insights which can be the basis for future activities aimed at

SERIES OF LECTURES WITH THE ANTHROPOLOGICAL AND HISTORICAL SOCIETY OF VALLECAMONICA

The last two events in February ended the series of meetings on the history and anthropology of the Alps, organized by [SSA Val Cam – Anthropological and Historical Society of Vallecamonica](#).

On 1st March *Dr. Ivan Faiferri* talked about the world of "Ancient cadastres and land registers: historical sources for studying the territory". The meeting was divided into two parts: a short lecture, providing tips for finding and consulting ancient land registers, and a workshop phase, during which participants performed a small research project in the Edolo area by examining the Napoleonic cadastre.
