#### **EUSALP - NEW WEBSITE ONLINE**

EUSALP, the fourth EU macro-regional strategy, was set up to meet the major challenges that require a common response in the Alpine Region, to stimulate an innovative and sustainable model of development, to promote growth and employment and at the same time to valorise the natural and cultural resources of the area.

EUSALP now has a new website (<a href="http://www.alpine-region.eu">http://www.alpine-region.eu</a>) in line with these objectives, in order to provide useful information and tools for governments and for regions, for administrators and stakeholders but also to create direct dialogue with the 80 million people living in 48 regions and 7 countries, 5 of which are EU Member States (Austria, France, Germany, Italy and Slovenia) as well as Liechtenstein and Switzerland. The web site will provide up-to-date information on EUSALP and the activities of the 9 Action Groups, on projects with direct impact on territories, on the programme of meetings and events organized throughout the Macroregion by various stakeholders.

The focus will be on issues that emerged from the survey conducted in 2014 and which formed the core content of the EUSALP Action Plan: growth and innovation, research and training, transport, connectivity and communications, protection of the environment, sustainable use of resources.

The site allows users to play **an active part** in processes by asking the various Action Groups questions and sending possible suggestions, subscribing to the newsletter, sharing information through their own social networks. The EUSALP online environment is designed to grow over time: in the coming months it will be enhanced with the provision of dynamic mapping tools, interactive infographic representation of data and results and publications on various issues and strategies.

The award rewards study activities carried out for a thesis and aims to encourage new graduates' interest in research and in-depth analysis of issues related to the development of mountain areas.

ADVANCED COURSE IN SUSTAINABLE TOURISM FOR MOUNTAIN AREAS

60 HOURS on campus and virtual classroom 6th March – 24th May 2017 ENROLMENT DEADLINE 9 FEBRUARY 2017

The course, for which timetable and contents are now available, will be held by university professors, experts and professionals from many sectors and disciplinary approaches in order to provide students with an updated and detailed background regarding the latest development prospects in this key area. The lectures, delivered on campus or via virtual classroom, will begin on 6<sup>th</sup> March and will usually be held on Mondays and Wednesdays in

two hour modules (14:00-18:00 or 16:00-18:00). The introductory lesson will be held by the two organizational managers of the course: Anna Giorgi, Director of the Centre of Applied Studies for the Sustainable Management and Protection of Mountain Areas GE.S.DI.MONT and Leader of Action Group 1 of the European Strategy for the Alpine Region, will provide a framework on tourism as a growth sector as part of the cooperation strategies at an Alpine macro-regional level, while Antonella Capriello, of the Department of Business Management and Environment at the University of Eastern Piedmont will introduce Tourism Marketina and Management in Mountain The following lessons will be held by Gianfranco Spinelli and Davide Porporato (University of Eastern Piedmont) on the topic of Sustainable Tourism from an economic and social viewpoint; Franco Brevini (University of Bergamo and Corriere della Sera), who will deal with cultural heritage as a resource for tourism in mountain areas; Ilda Vagge (University of Milan), whose lecture will deal with landscape as a resource for tourism; Stefania Cerutti (University of Eastern Piedmont), who will describe initiatives and projects of organization and planning of territories; Roberto Maggioni (Maggioni Tourist Marketing) on Marketing and promotion of tourism, who will provide a series of examples and case studies regarding international best practices.

Giovanni Vassena and Pietro Beretta (Pearls of the Alps) will talk about strategic marketing as part of tourism in villages and will discuss cases and experiences in the Alps; Flavia Cellerino (Celeber SRL) will deal with slow tourism, tourism for walkers, on the hidden culture of rural areas; Alessandro Meinardi (ERSAF and Stelvio National Park) will describe tourism in natural parks, and in particular the example of the Stelvio National Park; Ilaria Tonetto (Agenzia comunicazione Koinè) and Marianna Vianello (Progetto KID pass) will describe the types of tourism dedicated to children, with examples of strategic projects and means of communication for welcoming children and families. Tobias Luthe (University of Chur and School of Sustainable Tourism, Ostana) will give a presentation in English dedicated to the resilience of tourism to climate change; then there will be speeches by Claudio Smiraglia (University of Milan), who will explore the theme of **glaciers** and their use in the context of Alpine tourism, pointing out possible new risks and opportunities in high mountains; **Maurizio Droli** (adjunct lecturer at the University of Udine and the University of Milan-Bicocca), will speak about the idea of **albergo diffuso**, proposing models and good practices; **Antonella Capriello** (University of Eastern Piedmont) will speak on the theme of **silver tourism**, and **Giulio Senes** (University of Milan) will provide a contribution regarding **historic routes**, **ancient railways and routes on foot**. INTERNSHIP: EVALUATION OF PRODUCTION AND QUALITY EFFICIENCY IN BIONDA DELL'ADA-MELLO GOATS

An internship is available starting March 2017 for the evaluation of the production and quality levels of *BIONDA DELL'ADAMELLO* GOAT milk at the Breed Improvement Centre at Fresine (BS). The objective is to follow lactation of about thirty goats, with weekly visits, collecting samples and taking various measurements (milking speed, ingestion of food, grazing behaviour, cheese yield). The internship is open to 2 students, car essential. Supervising lecturer: **prof. Alberto Tamburini** 

# INTERNSHIP: EVALUATION OF THE SUSTAINABILITY AND EFFICIENCY OF A HIGHLAND CATTLE BREEDING FARM

The internship will be carried out during 2017 and will involve the evaluation of pastures and meadows used for a Highland cattle "cow-calf line" farm in Val Brembana. The objective is to monitor the quantitative and qualitative availability of meadow and pasture grass and the number of animals in order to evaluate the sustainability and environmental impact of the breeding farm. Students interested, who should be from the Val Brembana (BG) area and have their own car, will have to carry out surveys regarding the floristic characterization of meadows and pastures, livestock management, and business operations. Students must be able to carry out floristic relevés (course of Agronomy). Supervising lecturer: prof. Alberto Tamburini

PASTURS PROJECT - REDUCTION OF RISK ARISING FROM THE RETURN OF LARGE CARNIVORES IN THE OROBIE BERGAMASCHE ALPS AS AN OPPORTUNITY FOR THE SUSTAINABLE DEVELOPMENT OF LOCAL COMMUNITIES

Two very important species that inspire both enthusiasm and controversy are returning to the Orobie Bergamasche Alps: the bear and the wolf. The conflict between large carnivores and livestock activities is a major cause of the persecution carried out by man against predators. The reduction of potential damage can be achieved through the adoption of preventive measures such as using guard dogs to defend domestic livestock, fencing in animals and surveillance by the shepherd. Dissertations/internships and recognition of credits are available for university students.

The project involves training and then a period in a mountain farmstead (minimum 1 week - maximum 3 months) to provide knowledge and practical help in the field in all aspects of the shepherds' activities. Students will provide expertise and best practices on issues regarding the conservation of ecosystems while shepherds will provide their experience and knowledge of the local area.

#### PROJECT IMPLEMENTATION



AGREEMENT SIGNED BETWEEN LOMBARDY REGION AND UNIMONT FOR THE ENHANCEMENT OF MOUNTAIN AREAS IN LOMBARDY BY MEANS OF SCIENTIFIC AND APPLIED RESEARCH AND THE DISSEMINATION OF KNOWLEDGE REGARDING NEW REGIONAL, NATIONAL AND EUROPEAN SCENARIOS

Lombardy Region and UNIMONT signed an agreement aimed at fostering local and area networking activities in order to facilitate the promotion of research, training, experimentation and study activities for the development and enhancement of mountain areas in line with European and national processes on 14<sup>th</sup> December 2016. The agreement will facilitate the planning and promotion of study, research and training activities, also within European programs and funds, to be carried out in close collaboration with the Lombardy Region, and will allow sectors strategic for the economic development of Lombardy mountain areas to be strengthened.

The agreement will facilitate:

- Technology transfer to promote business development, particularly for young entrepreneurs in mountain areas:
- The development, promotion and set up of information dissemination and training activities in strategic sectors for the economic development of mountain areas and the identification and promotion of good practices and support activities;
- Adequate provision and dissemination of knowledge on mountain issues, on programmes and measures for funding activities and, in support of the application of regional policies for the development of mountain areas, in particular provision of up-to-date information regarding legislation and regional, national and European calls, especially those related to innovative businesses and youth entrepreneurship, including in the agricultural and rural sector;
- Planning and activation of capacity building measures for local government institutions re-

garding the training, continuing professional development and improvement of human resources, policy formulation processes and the organization and management structures of such organizations.

These paths can also be undertaken through the use of **online tools and methods** as well as thanks to the capitalization of educational experiences provided to date. This recognition is another confirmation of the quality and excellence of the work that the Mountain University, the Edolo Campus of the University of Milan, is currently providing to highlight that mountains are places full of resources and opportunities, no longer marginalized, but the new frontier of modern development models.

JOINT PLANNING OF THE "LOMBARDY APPENNINES -OLTREPÒ PAVESE" INLAND AREAS NATIONAL STRA-TEGY NOW STARTED

More than 200 innovators together with the administrators of the Alto Oltrepò Pavese will be working on development in the Lombardy Appennines. The joint planning phase involves local institutions, the Lombardy Region and the National Committee for Internal areas for the construction of the National Strategy for Internal Areas "Lombardy Apennines - Alto Oltrepò Pavese".

Work involving local institutions started in early January 2017and will last for about 9 months, with technical support from the MOUNTAIN UNIVERSITY confirmed by the Comunità Montana dell'Oltrepò Pavese. The National Strategy for Internal Areas "Lombardy Apennines -Alto Oltrepò Pavese" was launched on 10th January 2017 in Varzi (PV) in the presence of Ugo Parolo, Undersecretary to the Presidency in charge of Relations with the Regional Council, Policies for Mountain Areas, Alpine Macroregion (Eusalp), Quattro Motori per l'Europa and Programmazione negoziata as well as Giovanni Carrosio member of the National Technical Committee for Internal Areas. The meeting launching the joint planning of the National Internal Areas Strategy was characterized, as pointed out during the opening ceremony by the Mayor of the Lead Municipality of Varzi Gianfranco Alberti, by great involvement and participation of all local stakeholders and is a demonstration of the strong will to work as a team to meet the challenge of creating a strong and concrete development strategy for the Alto Oltrepò Pavese area.

These first months of work will start by analysing the current situation and listening to local viewpoints in order to define expected results as well as an overall vision to reverse the current critical trends (depopulation, ageing, hydrogeological instability, loss of internal and ex-

ternal networks, material and immaterial depletion, inaccessibility of environmental and cultural assets, abandonment of agricultural and production activities) and will finish by creating a final development strategy together with the Lombardy Region and the National Committee for Internal Areas. The challenge has started, it's time to get to work!

24<sup>TH</sup> JANUARY 2017 – CONFERENCE "IMPORTANCE OF FOREST PROTECTION AND BIO-ENGINEERING WORKS IN HYDROGEOLOGICAL RISK AREAS"

Massimiliano Schwarz - Berner Fachhocschule-Hochschule für Agrar-, Forts- und Lebensmittelwissenschaften held the conference "Importance of forest protection and bio-engineering works in hydrogeological risk areas " on Tuesday 24<sup>th</sup> January 2017 in the Main Hall of the Mountain University in Edolo.

#### **CONTENTS:**

Mountain forests have long been used by man also as a form of protection against natural hazards, especially landslides, debris flows, rock falls and avalanches. The protective function of forests in case of hydrogeological instability is linked, in particular, to the action of the roots that are able to mechanically strengthen the soil and reduce moisture content. The quantification of these effects and forest management to maximize such effects was, and is, the subject of extensive research. At the same time plants can be used, alone or in combination with inert materials, in works to prevent and mitigate hydrogeological instability as part of bioengineering projects combining the need for both safety and quality of the environment and the landscape. The conference addressed issues related to the role of plants, both from a forestry and a bio-engineering work point of view. Click to see the recording
